- 20 000 people trained (2003)

- 15 000 people trained online (2008–2010)
- 16.000 people trained to use PC and main e-services (2010-2012, ESF).

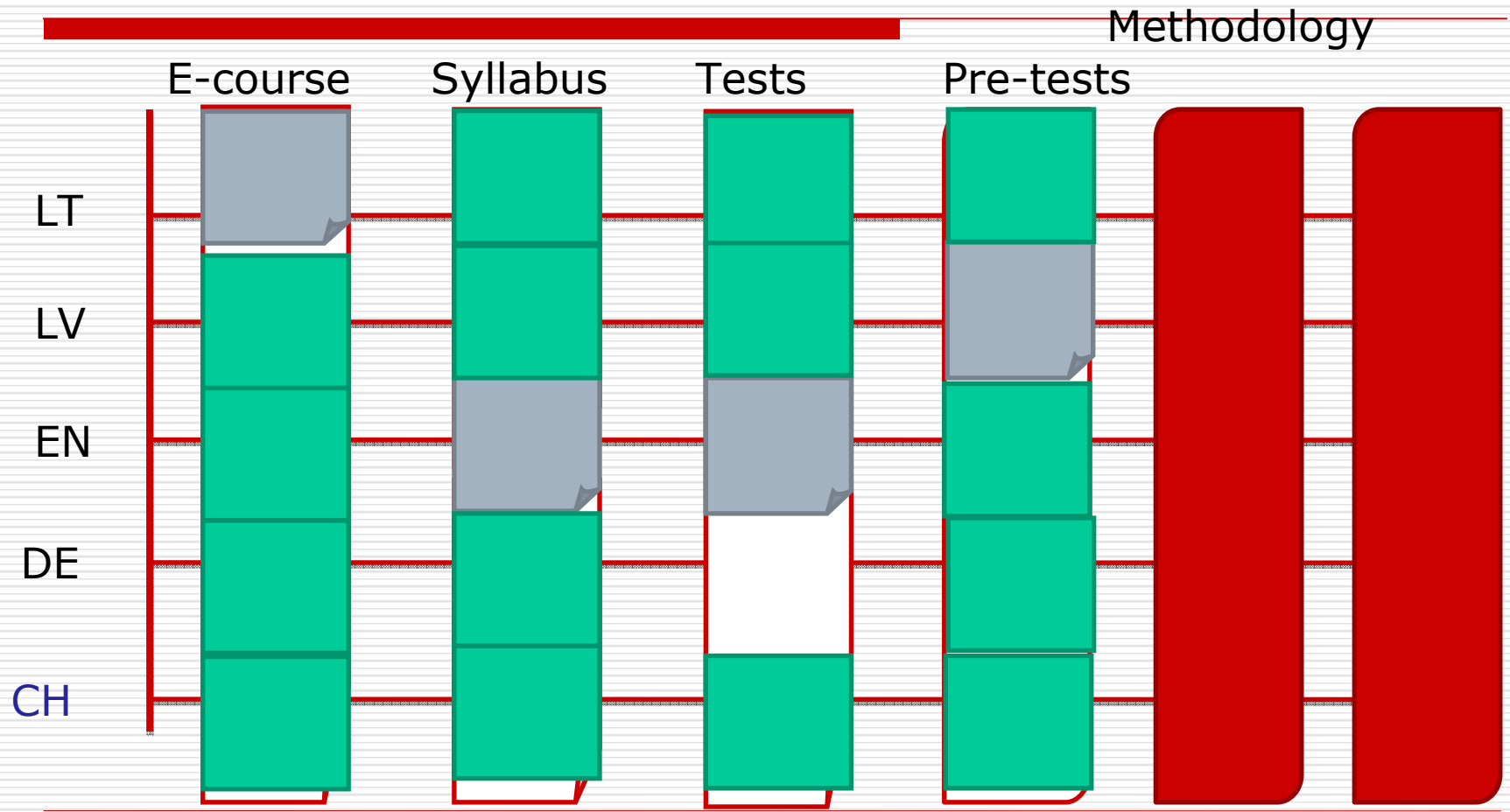

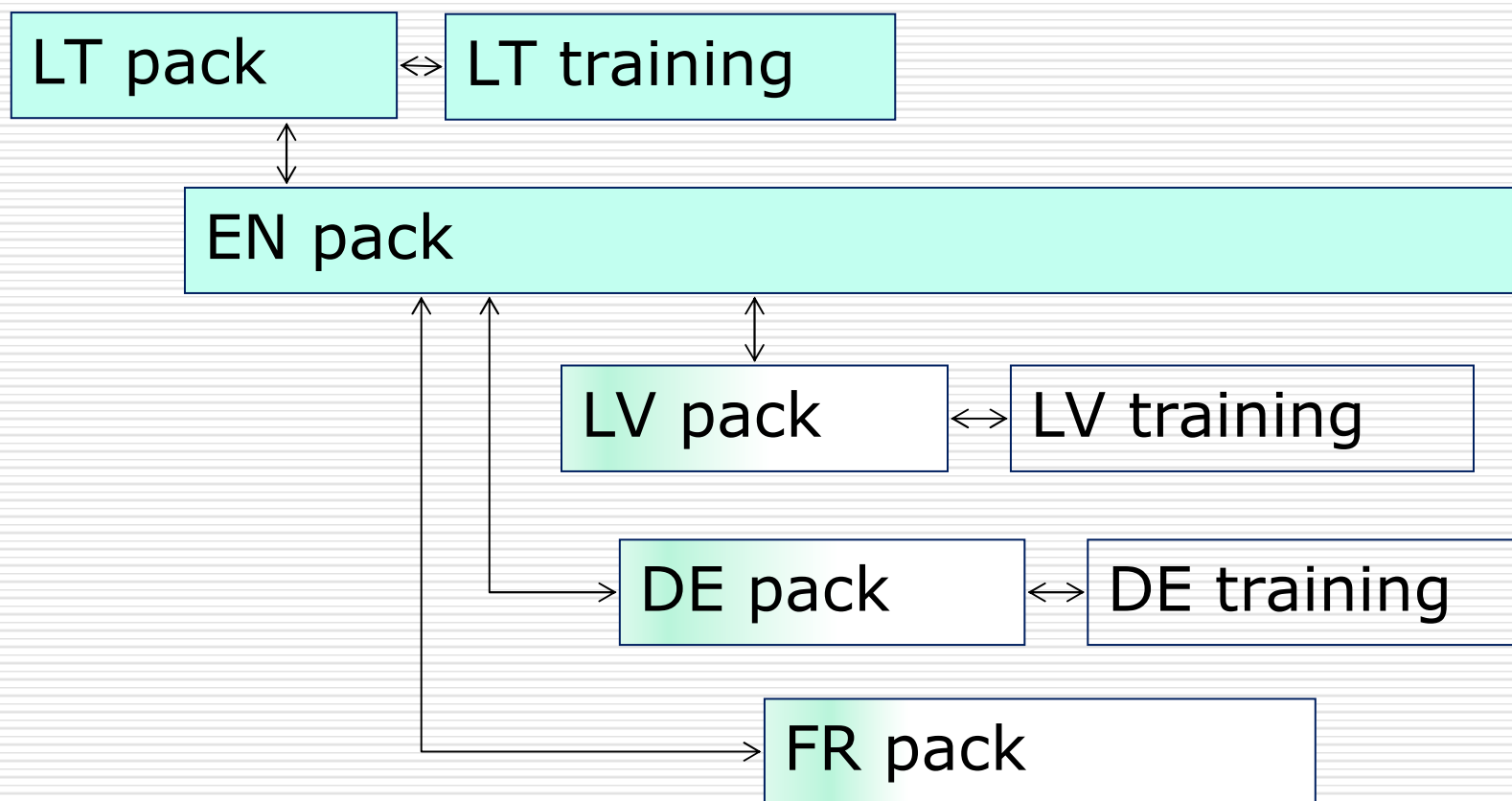
